In this lyrical and richly illustrated story of love, faith, and the meaning of it all, Sís shows the pain and beauty of the human journey.

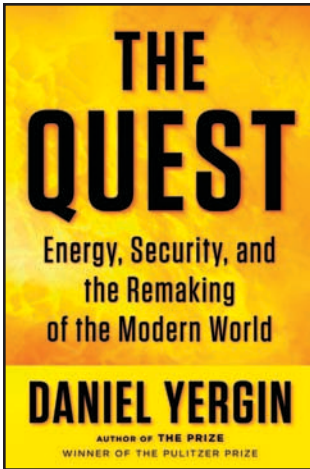

Poetry has been the most powerful vehicle for conveying Sufism—the mystical dimension of Islam—from the early flowering in Baghdad to the later heights it reached through Jalaluddin Rumi (d. 1273) and Jami (d. 1492).

Starting with the writings of 8th-century mystics, this anthology moves through the 12th century with Ibn Arabi in Spain and Ibn Farid of Cairo, then onto the Maghrib prayer of Abul Ala Al Maari, Aynul Quddat Hamdhdhani of Persia, Yunus Emre of Turkey in the 14th century, finally culminating in the early 20th century. The result is a soaring collection of verse from across the Islamic world and over centuries of inspiration.

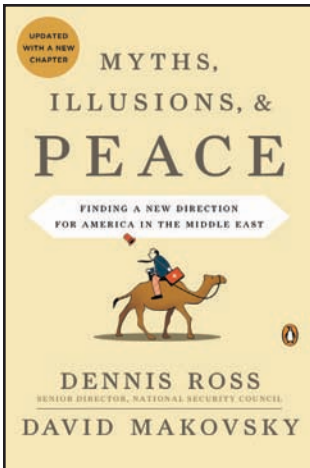

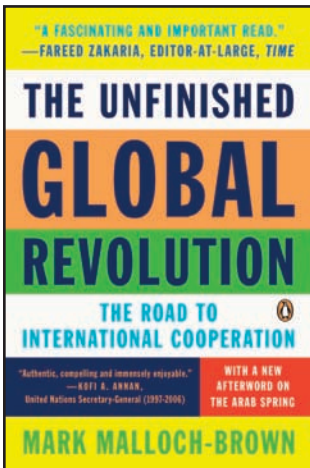
