Edited with an Introduction by Alfred Kazin. New Afterword by Tom Wolfe. The story of a pretty young woman's fall in New York's Bowery shocked the country in 1893. Includes 5 other stories. Replaces ISBN 0-451-52552-3.

THE RED BADGE OF COURAGE AND OTHER STORIES—Stephen Crane (Penguin Classics December 336 pp. 0-14-303935-0 \$9.00)

Edited with an Introduction and Notes by Gary Scharnhorst. "The first great 'modern' novel of war by an American" (Alfred Kazin), as well as "The Open Boat," "The Bride Comes to Yellow Sky," "The Blue Hotel," "The Self-Made Man," and "The Veteran." Replaces ISBN 0-14-039081-2.

ETHAN FROME—Edith Wharton (Penguin Classics November 96 pp. 0-14-243780-8 \$8.00)

Introduction and Notes by Elizabeth Ammons. One of American fiction's finest and most intense narratives, in which an ill-starred trio plunges toward a tragic destiny. Replaces ISBN 0-14-018736-7.

SELECTED WRITINGS—Rubén Darío (Penguin Classics November 608 pp. 0-14-303936-9 \$16.00)

Translated by Andrew Hurley, Greg Simon, and Stephen F. White. Edited with an Introduction by Ilan Stavans. A career-spanning selection—including poetry and prose—of the Nicaraguan-born writer who pioneered the Modernista movement.

THE PORTABLE HAWTHORNE—Nathaniel Hawthorne (Penguin Classics December 672 pp. 0-14-303928-8 \$18.00)

Edited with an Introduction by William C. Spengemann. Includes works from each major stage in the career of the great American artist, from his early tales and *The Scarlet Letter* in its entirety to selections from his subsequent romances and passages from his European journals. Replaces ISBN 0-14-015038-2.

CALEB WILLIAMS—William Godwin (Penguin Classics September 448 pp. 0-14-144123-2 \$14.00)

Edited with an Introduction by Maurice Hindle. The husband of Mary Wollstonecraft wrote this radical novel to expose the political oppression in the world around him. Replaces ISBN 0-14-043256-6.

THE CANTERBURY TALES—Geoffrey Chaucer (Penguin Classics September 1,328 pp. 0-14-042234-X \$17.00)

Edited with an Introduction and Notes by Jill Mann. This new original-spelling edition features a freshly established Middle English text with standardized spelling and punctuation and on-page glossing.

THE LIFE AND ADVENTURES OF SANTA CLAUS—L. Frank Baum (Signet Classics November 176 pp. 0-451-52997-9 \$4.95)

New Introduction by Michael O. Riley. Afterword by Max Apple. After growing up in an enchanted forest with the master woodsman Ak, Claus makes his first toy, chooses his reindeer, and starts climbing down chimneys. Replaces ISBN 0-451-52064-5.

Introduction by Benjamin DeMott. New Afterword by Dennis Johnson. As he matures into manhood in a British working-class family, the artist Paul Morel is torn between affection for his mother and desire for two young beauties. Replaces ISBN 0-451-51882-9.

THE HUNCHBACK OF NOTRE-DAME—Victor Hugo (A Chamberlain Bros. paperback and DVD October 496 pp. 1-59609-171-1 \$14.95)

Translated by Walter J. Cobb. Afterword by Graham Robb. The unabridged Signet Classics edition is complemented by a DVD featuring the classic silent film adaptation starring Lon Chaney Sr.

OLIVER TWIST—Charles Dickens

(A Chamberlain Bros. paperback and DVD November 608 pp. 1-59609-173-8 \$14.95)

Afterword by Edward Le Comte. Dickens's most-loved novel comes with a DVD of the 1933 Cowen adaptation, starring Dickie Moore as Oliver.

THE SCARLET LETTER—Nathaniel Hawthorne (A Chamberlain Bros. paperback and DVD September 272 pp. 1-59609-175-4 \$14.95)

Introduction by Brenda Wineapple. The iconic American novel is paired with a DVD of the 1934 Vignola movie adaptation starring Colleen Moore and Alan Hale.
